#### Let us find out more about living habits of birds

Birds build nests so that they have a place to lay eggs. They use cotton, thread, wood, twigs, dry leaves, hair, stones etc. to make their nests. Nests also protect the chicks and the parent birds from enemies and bad weather.

Let us look at the nests of some birds.

#### Weaver Bird

This bird uses its beak to weave the nest using dry strips of palm leaves. This hanging nest is deep enough to prevent the baby birds from falling. The entrance in the nest is from the lower end.



#### Tailor bird

The tailor bird stitches two leaves together with its beak using a thread or wood. The nest is made cosy with cotton, wool, soft fibre and hair.



The woodpecker pecks into the tree-trunk with its sharp beak and makes a hole. The hole is then lined with soft chips of wood to make its nest cosy.

#### **Vulture**

The vulture collects a few sticks and puts them together high up on a large tree. The nest looks like a shallow cup.







#### **Sparrows and Pigeons**

Sparrows and pigeons build their nests on window-edges, ventilators and even on ceiling fans. They make untidy nests using twigs, grass, leaves, small pieces of cloth and feathers.

#### Cuckoo

A cuckoo does not build a nest at all. In fact, it lays its eggs in the nests of other birds. The other mother bird mostly crow hatches the eggs of the cuckoo along with its own eggs.

#### Penguin

Penguin collects small stones, pebbles and bones and puts them together to make its nest. It makes its nest on the ground.




## Do you know?

Kiwi is the only bird which locates its prey by smell.



Birds lay their eggs as soon as their nests are ready. The mother birds sit on the eggs to give warmth to the eggs. The father birds guard the nest and protect the eggs from enemies. The parents feed their young ones and look after them till they grow their own feathers and are ready to fly out into the out- side world.
