We have learnt that the climate of our country is not the same, it varies from one place to another. On the hilly regions, it is very cold. The southern region is very hot. Some regions have heavy rainfall, some regions are dry. These diversities in climate affect our dresses as well as our food habits. People of our country wear different types of clothes in different seasons.







We can recognise people by the style of their dresses.

Every state has some traditional wear with which we can recognise them. This is known as their traditional dress. However, some dresses are very common and they are worn mostly in every part of our country.

Women's Clothes: The most popular dresses of women in our country are saree-blouse, salwar-kameez and ghagra (skirt)-choli with chunri (odhani).

The style of wearing these dresses varies from one state to another.

In the same way, ghagra-choli with odhani is worn in many states like Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Kerala. In Kerala, it is known as mundublouse. Nowadays, young girls and women like to wear churidar, pyjama, kurta, trousers, t-shirts and skirts.

Some Facts: Until about 200 years ago, we had no machines for making clothes.

Men's Clothes: The most common dress of men in our country is trousers with a shirt. Other popular dresses are dhoti-kurta, kurta-pyjama, lungi-kurta. In some states, people still like to wear their traditional dresses.

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In Rajasthan, people wear achkan (angrakha) with a turban. In Gujarat, they wear churidar-pyjama with a jacket. Dhoti-kurta is worn widely in Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Bihar and Asom.



Men in Different Dresses

■ Some Facts:

In Nagaland, we can recognize many tribes by the designs, stripes and colours of their shawls.

Turban is an important part of men's costume in India. We can recognise a man by looking his turban to which state he belongs to. Turban is a part of traditional dress. Some people like to wear caps. People in Gujarat wear Gandhi caps. Fur caps are worn in Kashmir. Caps of Himachal Pradesh are famous all over India. These are very colourful having beautiful embroidery. Besides these dresses, people like to wear jeans, t-shirts and trousers.



Clothes for Special Occasions: People who do special jobs wear special clothes. Policeman wears khaki dress. Doctors and nurses wear white dresses. Soldiers wear a special uniform as they represent our country. Children wear special dress for school. These special dresses are called uniforms.









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On special occasions like marriages, birthdays and such other joyous moments, people like to wear colourful, bright clothes. These clothes are often made of silk and brocade. They like to wear gold, silver and diamond jewellery.
