

Venu looked up and said, "That would be great. Let's all go for 'Lincoln'. We'll leave at 6 p.m."

Sarala nodded, "That's fine. It must be a very good movie."

As Sarala went to the kitchen, Keerti held her father's hand, "Daddy, please tell me about Lincoln. Who was he? Was he a great man? Why has someone made a movie on him?"



Venu sat down comfortably on a chair and said, "Well, well. One question at a time, dear. Let me begin by saying that Abraham Lincoln was one of the greatest leaders of America. He was the sixteenth President of the United States. He held his office from 1861 to 1865."

Keerti bent forward and said, "Daddy, was his father also a President?"

"No, he wasn't. In fact, Abraham Lincoln was born in a log cabin in Kentucky to Thomas Lincoln and Nancy Hanks Lincoln. Abraham had an older sister and a younger brother who died in infancy." log cabin: a cabin built of logs infancy: period of early childhood

"The Lincolns moved from Kentucky to Indiana due to some land problems in 1817. They made a living by hunting and farming on a small plot of land. When Abraham was nine years old, his mother passed away due to milk sickness. After a few months, his father remarried. Abraham's stepmother was a strong and affectionate woman named Sarah Bush Johnson. She had three children of her own. Abraham Lincoln grew close to her and she encouraged him to read."

Keerti looked shocked, "But do you mean to say that he never went to school?"

"He was mainly self-educated. He received formal education for just about eighteen months, may be a few days or weeks at a time. You will be amazed to know that he was very



fond of reading. He would often walk miles to borrow books from others" said his neighbours.

"What kind of books did he like to read?"

"He read all the popular books at that time such as *Aesop's Fables, Robinson Crusoe, Pilgrim's Progress* and of course the family Bible."

"Later, the family shifted to Illinois. Abraham was often called by his nickname, 'Honest Abe'. He was tall and thin. But he was strong. He would often cut wood with an axe and was good at it. At Illinois, he worked as a shopkeeper, a postmaster and even a general store owner as years passed. He soon became popular in the area."

"But how did he become the President of such a big country like the United States?" said Keerti.

"You see," continued Venu," he got involved in political activities and opposed slavery very strongly. He also practised law. He struggled a lot throughout. But he never gave up. Finally, he was elected the sixteenth President of USA in 1861 and re-elected after his first term as President."

Meanwhile Sarala came in with a cup of tea and biscuits. She said "How do you remember all the details so clearly?" Venu took a sip and said, "You see, I read his biography recently. I remember reading that he was the first important political figure who suggested that women should also have the right to vote. He



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supported women's rights." Keerti and Sarala exclaimed, "Wow! That was great" "He was assassinated in April, 1865 by John Wilkes Booth at Ford's Theater, Washington DC. Wilkes Booth was a supporter of slavery. The world mourned Lincoln's death."

Keerti said, "Truly, he was a great leader." Sarala stood up, "Yes. Now let's get ready to leave." Venu added, "I don't want to miss the show." Keerti got up, "Daddy, now I will really enjoy the movie as you have told me a lot about Abraham Lincoln." Venu merely looked at her, and said "Remember all that I told you about this great man. He rose in life because of his own determination and perseverance."

Pronouns and Kinds of Pronouns

A pronoun is a word used in place of a noun. 'He, 'she', 'they', 'me' and 'you' are some commonly used pronouns. There are different kinds of pronouns.

Personal Pronouns

Personal pronouns are words like I, me, we, ours, you, your, they, them, he, him, she, her, it and so on.

Personal pronouns are said to be in the first person when they refer to the person speaking, e.g., I, me, mine, we, us, ours.

Personal pronouns in the second person, refer to the person spoken to, e.g., you and yours.

We use personal pronouns in the third person to refer to persons spoken about, e.g., he, she, it, him, her, his, they, them and their.

Examples: 1. Parul went to watch a movie. She liked it.

2. Her parents followed her. They also liked it.

The coloured words are personal pronouns.

We use personal pronouns like we, you, he, she, it and they as subjects in sentences because they refer to persons or things we talk about.

Example: We are tired. (subject)

Personal pronouns like me, us, him, her and them are always used as objects in sentences. They receive the result of actions caused by the subject in a sentence.

Example: The teacher told us to be quiet.

Possessive pronouns are words like 'mine', 'ours', 'yours', 'theirs', 'his' and 'hers'. They are always used to show possession.

Example: All the bags on the table are theirs.

Demonstrative Pronouns

Demonstrative Pronouns are used to point at the nouns. Pronouns like 'this', 'these', 'that' and 'those' are demonstrative pronouns.

Examples: 1. This is a ripe mango.

More About Pronouns

Relative Pronouns are used to show relationship. We use pronouns like 'that', 'which', 'who', 'whose' and 'whom' as relative pronouns. They are placed immediately after the nouns or pronouns they refer to.

- Examples: 1. Namita wore the dress that mother gifted her. She took the purse which she bought yesterday. She went with her friend who is her neighbour.
 - 2. This is the boy whose motorbike was stolen yesterday from the mall, and he is the person whom the police called for interrogation.

Interrogative pronouns are used to ask questions and they come at the beginning of questions.

Words like who, whom, what, whose and which are interrogative pronouns.

Examples: 1. Who was the sixteenth President of the United States?




Trees are the kindest things I know,
