He looks for his kite here and there, but he doesn't find it. When he is looking for his kite, a little girl comes out, and they soon become friends.

Nitin: Oh, hi! I am looking for my kite. Oh! It is near the door.

Meena: Let me get it.

Nitin: Thanks.

Meena: I am Meena. What is your name?

Nitin: My name is Nitin. I used to think that nobody lives here.

Meena: We have just come to this house.

Nitin: Welcome to this place, Meena. We are neighbours now. If

you need anything, please let me know. I'll be happy to help

you.

Meena: Thanks, Nitin! Will you be my friend?

Nitin: Of course, Meena, I will be your friend. We will play together

every day. We will fly kites and make paper boats too.

Meena: My mother will her mother.)	Meena: My mother will be happy to meet you. (Meena calls out for her mother.)					
Meena: Hey Mom! See who has come to our garden. I have a new friend, Nitin. (Meena turns to her mother as she comes out.) Mom, this is Nitin.						
Mom : Hello, Nitin, I am Meena's mother. I am happy to see that you have become friends.						
Nitin: Hello, aunty. It is nice meeting you and Meena. Bye Meena, we will play tomorrow.


Words that tell us about what a person or a thing does, are called action or doing words. We also call these words verbs. All the coloured words in the examples are action words (verbs).






