












Read and Enjoy

Describing words are called adjectives.

In sentence (1), the describing word tall just tells us about the height of Priya. It is in the positive degree. We speak just about one quality and do not make any comparison.

In sentence (2), the describing word taller tells us about Sushma's height being compared to Priya's. It is said to be in the comparative degree. Here - 'er' is added to the describing word. For example, 'tall' - 'taller'. We also use 'than' with the adjective to indicate comparison.



Joining words are used to join words, groups of words or sentences. It's clear from the above examples that we use 'and' to join similar things or ideas.

We use 'but' when we join two words, ideas or sentences that mean the opposite of each other.

We use 'or' to show that there is a choice between two things or persons.


